In-Service Day Debrief

On Monday October 15, 2018 the teachers, assistants, aides, and therapists participated in a full day of professional development and training. The day, one of many scheduled throughout the year aimed at keeping staff up-to-date with the most current relevant practices and information to Clelian Heights School, featured three sessions. We wanted to share a bit of what was discussed in each session and send a thank you for giving our staff the time to better themselves to help our students.

This session was presented by Tom Horan, Clelian Heights board member, retired police officer, and criminology professor. He discussed the importance of school safety and preparedness, as well as the established procedures for dealing with incidents if they should ever occur at Clelian Heights. Mr. Horan also provided new and additional details about staying safe, developing a plan, and mitigating possible problems. Clelian Heights would like to thank Mr. Horan for coming to speak to us and share his law enforcement expertise.

Session One

The second session was presented by Victoria Maher, Educational Technology Specialist. She demonstrated the use of the InFocus Board. The board is a digital touch panel, and is located in the STEM/Science classroom. The training was the third in a series of best technology techniques that will simplify tasks and make learning easier and more fun. Miss Maher discussed the basic features of the InFocus Board and its uses.

Session Two

The final session was presented by Melissa Fligger Ph.D., room 104 teacher, and doctor of Instructional Management and Leadership. Dr. Fligger presented her dissertation work, which focused on Video Modeling in the Special Education Classroom. Video Modeling allows a student to view the procedures, steps, or behaviors needed to complete a skill. Dr. Fligger provided staff with example videos and various uses for video modeling that the teachers can use with their student(s).

Beatification of Blessed Mother Clelia Merloni



Blessed Clelia Merloni Foundress of the Apostles of the Sacred Heart of Jesus from Whom Clelian Heights Received its Name

The Sisters of Clelian Heights Are Are Excited to Announce:

The foundress of the Apostles of the Sacred Heart of Jesus -- the Community of Sisters at Clelian Heights --Blessed Mother Clelia Merloni, will be beatified on November 3, 2018. Beatification is the last step before Canonization. This means that she is recognized as Blessed by the church, and at least one miracle has been acquired through her intercession in addition to having her recognized for her heroic virtue.

Canonization means that she will be recognized as a Saint. Canonization requires a second miracle after Beatification. So, we are praying now that Mother Clelia intercede with a healing miracle in someone's life. Once this second miracle has been received through her intercession, the Pope will declare her a Saint.

Sr. Deborah Lopez, our Executive Director and Sr. Charlene Celli, Principal, are among the Sisters that are attending this special celebration at Basilica of St. John Lateran in Rome, Italy.

Say This Prayer to the Blessed Trinity to Obtain Graces or a Miracle Through the Intercession of Blessed Clelia Merloni

O Most Holy Trinity, You who exalt the humble and comfound the proud, deign to hear my prayer, granting me, through the intercession of Your faithful servant, Mother Clelia, the grace I ardently desire.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen (3 times)

Who was Mother Clelia Merloni?

Clelia Merloni was born in Italy on March 10, 1861. As she matured, she became more attracted to prayer and solitude than to the elite social life and administration of the family business that her father wanted for her. She knew from an early age that following her father's footsteps in the family business was not the journey her life would take. Intelligent, gifted, and enthusiastic. she responded generously to God's call by choosing consecrated religious life.

On May 30, 1894, Mother Clelia founded the Congregation of the Apostles of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, using the rich energies of her charismatic zeal and the sizable inheritance from her father's estate to minister to the needy and marginalized. At the turn of the last century, she sent sisters to the Americas and the Congregation began to flourish though not without initial difficulties.

For the holiness needed to be able to fulfill God's will and to lead the Sisters, Mother Clelia has to sustain many years of difficult trials, profound humiliations, and unspeakable sorrows. Her life was consumed with daily kindness and sacrifices as well as with a profound amount of humility and forgiveness for those who did her wrong.

Mother Clelia died in Rome on November 21, 1930. Her body was placed in the Motherhouse chapel after her body was exhumed in 1945 and found to be incorrupt.

What should I donate?

According to the Food Bank website:

- Non-perishable items like canned or boxed items, juices, pastas, canned meats, sauces, prepared foods.
- Items free from obvious defect or contamination like a popped top on a can, mold, or rust.
- Items that have the original manufacturer's label to be able to be redistributed by the food bank.

Suggested Items:

canned tuna, chicken, or salmon

canned fruits and vegetables

macaroni and cheese

boxed meals like hamburger helper canned meals like stew or ravioli

cereal

peanut butter

deodorant

shampoo

diapers

paper towels

laundry and dish detergent

toilet tissue

baby soap

tooth paste

According to WCFB, Most needed items:

peanut butter

cereal

canned or pouched tuna. chicken, or salmon

boxed meals like mac & cheese or Hamburger Helper

heavier soups and stews

What can NOT be donated?

According to the Food Bank website, they can not accept:

- Homemade goods or canned items
- baby food in jars
- prescription drugs
- any items that has been opened or if the seal is broken.

Where can I put my donation?

Donations will be collected in the main lobby area. There will be an area for food items and an area for household items.
