Special Needs Adults Provide **Spectacular** Services

As the school doors of Clelian Heights closed for a summer break, The Clelian Center chose to remain open and provide its job contractors with service. The Clelian Center Business Service is a cost effective, dependable and high quality alternative to "temp hire" for repetitive tasks and for the first time since its inception, the workshop stayed "in business" three days each week throughout the month of June.

Each day between ten to fifteen men and women arrived for work at 8:45 a.m. and completed six different contracts. Assembly work from Pitt Industrial and Ventana as well as mailings from the Westmoreland Chamber of Commerce, ParentWise Inc. and the University of Pittsburgh at Greensburg offered a variety of tasks that were completed with precision and accuracy. A luncheon at Hempfield Park, a barbecue at Clelian Heights and a buffet luncheon at Sam's Club were well deserved treats enjoyed throughout the month.

Back to its "normal" routine during July, the workshop is open five days each week with thirty men and women working diligently to improve their skills while enjoying the camaraderie with one another and some summer fun.


CELEBRATING 45 YEARS!

Vision Statement:


