

Have you ever wondered About Clelian Heights' Beginnings?

In 1961 the Sisters—The Apostles of the Sacred Heart of Jesus—had an idea to help families help their children who had special needs. It all began with 4 sisters and 4 children. The sisters chose to reach out to educate children with disabilities because, at the time, these children were not included in schools leaving families with little guidance on how to help them. So on the 100th Anniversary of the birth of their foundress—Mother Clelia Merloni—Clelian Heights School opened as an educational facility where children with disabilities could come to learn skills that would enable them to have a fulfilling life. Provision was made so that even children who lived far from the school could attend and extend their opportunities for learning by staying in residence during the week and returning home for week-ends.

Clelian Heights grew so rapidly that the first school—a converted barn—was soon replaced by a state-of-the-art facility increasing Clelian's capacity and program offerings.

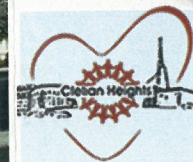
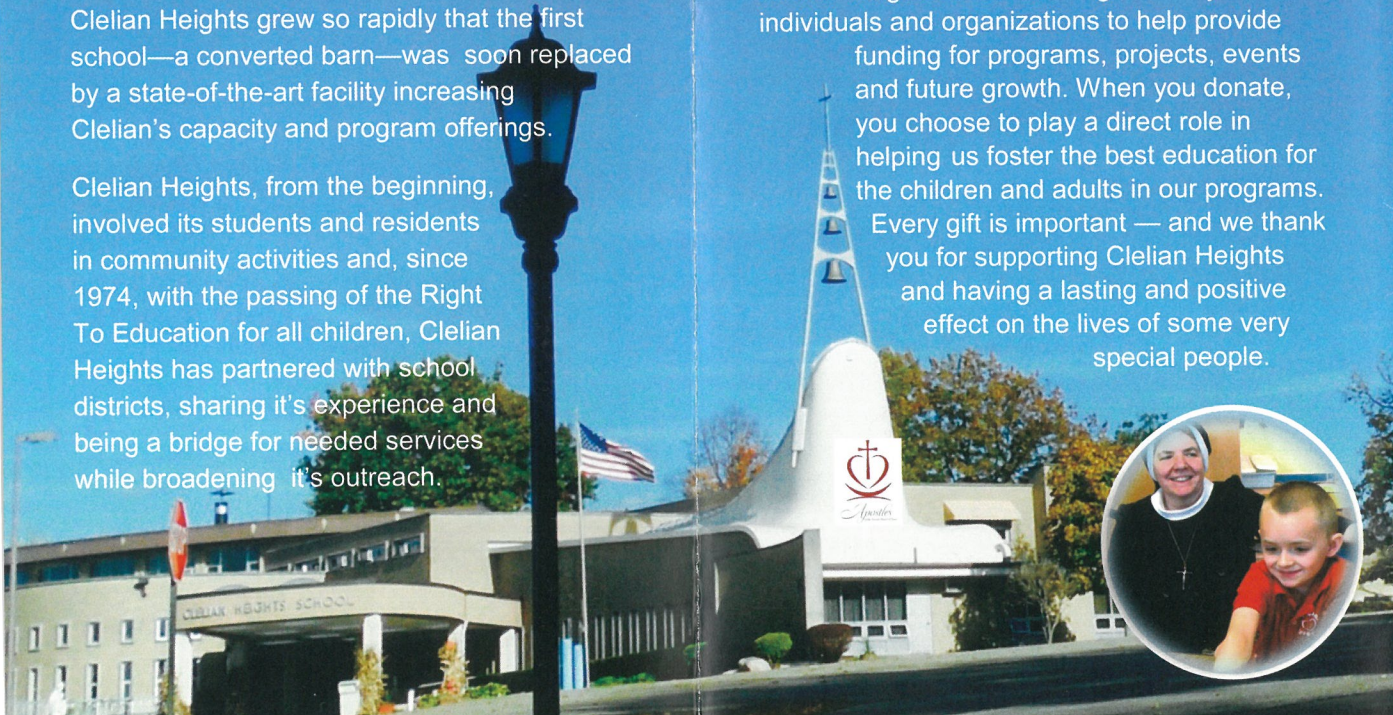

Today At Clelian Heights

Today, there are a wide variety of programs at Clelian Heights:

A Curriculum that covers reading and language arts, math, independent living skills, community-based instruction, technology skills, science and social studies, physical education, vocational skills including a transition-to-work program beginning at age 14, and social and everyday living skills.

Therapeutic Services that include physical, occupational and speech therapies and behavior services.

Extra-Curricular Activities that include swimming, sports teams, cheerleading, Special Olympics and clubs.

An Extended School Year Program (ESY) that runs four weeks during the summer to assist with maintenance of therapeutic and academic goals.

Adult Programs On The Continuum of Clelian Heights' services so that vocational training and employment, job coaching for community employment and daily living activities are available for adults.

Clelian Heights also provides practicum and service experience for interested high school and college students.
