
Anne Dejick Gift of Time Honoree


CATHOLIC SCHOOLS WEEK CELEBRATION; JANUARY 31-FEBRUARY 5,1993



CAMPBELL SOUP LABELS

GIANT EAGLE TAPES

This year's Apples for students program has ended. And again, thanks to your efforts, we have been successful! Even though the collection period was much shorter, we have enough Giant Eagle tapes to receive an Apple IIe Computer with monitor and disc drive and an Echo Speech Synthesizer. The majority of our computer equipment has been obtained by exchanging Giant Eagle tapes for computers through the Apples for Students program and this has enabled our computer curriculum to grow stronger year after year.



SETON HILL COLLEGE NUTRITION CLASS CONTINUES A TRADITION



For longer than most of us can remember, Seton Hill College students majoring in Home Economics or Dietetics have visited Clelian Heights, become acquainted with our young adults, and taught them some home economics tips. This year the Seton Hill students will come in mid March. On their first visit, they'll get to know all the Clelian Center students and then focus in on specific learning areas for the second visit which will include preparing a buffet dinner and sessions on planning meals, shopping for meals, and practicing basic sewing skills. They will also spend time in the grooming room with the young women, showing them hair styling and manicure.



MEDICAID ELIGIBILITY

Children with medical disabilities are eligible for Medicaid. Due to a little known loophole, most children with serious disabilities are eligible for Medicaid (also known as Medical Assistance.) Currently, most children with severe disabilities get Medicaid by qualifying for SSI. However, SSI counts the income and resources of the parents. Those children that meet the medical criteria for disability under SSI but whose parents' income make them ineligible for SSI can get Medicaid (a medical card) under this loophole. However, if your child was turned down for SSI because they didn't feel he or she met the SSI standard of disability, rather than for excess income, this loophiole does not apply. You must call your County Assistance Office or go there to get an application form. Make it clear that you are applying only for Medicaid for your child. You must put at the top of the first page, in large letters MA for Disabled Child Only-Handbook Section 355.4 — you are not asking for SSI, just medical assistance. This directs the workers at the County Assistance Office to the loophole and makes it clear you know about it.
